BIOGRAPHIES

Professor Nathalie Pettorelli Institute of Zoology, ZSL

Nathalie is a professor at the Institute of Zoology, the research arm of ZSL. Her expertise includes climate change ecology, satellite remote sensing/conservation technology, biodiversity monitoring, population and ecosystem dynamics and rewilding. An applied ecologist, Nathalie is the Editor in Chief of Remote Sensing in Ecology and Conservation, a scientific journal she founded with ZSL and Wiley in 2014 that focuses on the use of technology to advance ecological science and support wildlife management. She is the co-chair of the IUCN inter-commissional Rewilding Working Group, and authored a number of books and scientific contributions on biodiversity monitoring, satellite remote sensing and environmental management, and the science/policy interface.

Robin McKie The Observer

Robin is a writer known for his journalism in The Observer, a publication for which he serves as science and environment editor. As a result of his work, he has won awards from organizations such as the Medical Journalists' Association, reviving a citation in early 2014 for a feature on zebra fish research. He was named as "Science and Technology Journalist of the Year" during the UK Press Gazette Awards for 2013. In addition, he has written numerous books with a view to expanding popular interest in and understanding of biological science.



Billy Heaney Zoologist and Wildlife Presenter


Billy is a zoologist, wildlife tour guide and broadcaster. He collaborates with a number of UK wildlife organisations including Whale and Dolphin Conservation, Badger Trust and The Mammal Society, and he's a regular panelist on BBC Radio 4's Nature Table with Sue Perkins. He has also presented on BBC Countryfile, featured on BBC Points West and BBC Breakfast, as well as BBC SpringWatch and BBC Earth's digital channels. More recently, he has appeared on ITV This Morning and BBC World Service discussing orca and human interactions in the Iberian Gulf.

Bethan is the Senior Policy Specialist at ZSL.
