Tail 16 slightly rounded to 1 ½ inch in extreme laterals. Head & neck entirely of a black deep & glossy, back scapulars & the several wing flags falling into the [line] of scapulars, purplish dark brown mottled & streaked all over with yellow red or red yellow{ back darkest, least variegated) the markings disposed into vague crossbars on the larger flags. Tail coverts above the basal but darker grounded & the marks more obviously bar wide. Tail feathers black with a purplish or violet gloss & the laterals immaculate & [centrals]? crossed with 3 mottled bars of incandescent white, wing coverts above white with here & there visible indications of the black existing at the base of each plume - wings white with black shafts & purple black bases, the purple black extending more & more down the inner webs of the secondaries as they near the body & unite with the coloured & mottled tertiaries already noted as falling into line of scapulars the 2 or 3 first primaries also black throughout outer webs & at tips: entire body below & inner coverts of wings & tail purple black immaculate bill plumbeous with culmen darkened, iris *brown

Seven shot, all females or young 'tho full grown 6 months old. Born in June-July. Young just born found by a peasant there. Plumage full but males changing vestment ground colour. They have the black body & white wings of maturity but the mottled heads & necks of the female save one which has the black plumes protruding fast & by moult, tongue longish flat cartilaginous with tip slightly bifid. Intestines vary in length from 2 ½ to 3 feet caeca about 8 inches from anal end vary from 7 ½ to 8 inches.

2 & 6 below are a very fine couple killed June 3. Plumage here & there frayed but no one decisive sign of moult. They are pretty clearly a pair & a mature pair & prove (1) to have been a young bird unless indeed there be two species one lesser with ear ornaments & black neck & breast of wh. Sort (1) is a specimen with immature plumage & young, the other species larger & void of ear appendages or black plumes, art 3 for future observation 2 & 6 are, I conclude, a pair because killed in company & because whilst plumage of both is in the identical state (of fullness or the inverse) that one has just that sort of superior darkness in the tints wh. belongs to males. His quills too have that extreme pointedness wh. before noted as extreme in males, less noticeable in females, quills particularly darker & 2 or 3 first all black whereas in female buff with black bars like the rest. On looking closer I see moult in the quills & cannot ascertain their [fixed]? length & tertials very acutely pointed, secondaries wedged at tips.

3. Here is one of the smaller birds with the extremely acute quills & the [aigrettes]? half developed. Another the same day June 7 under full moult but not far advanced on belly or thighs, neck & head black plumes rapidly developing themselves & white one on the wing covets as if this bird would when moult complete assume the colour of the large species, we shall see! Scapulars & tail a l'ordinaire only darker & richer these parts doubtless having an (sic) uniform appearance always [aigrettes?]? in both species half out. N.B. Likhs moult begins with June or rather before.


